From the Rabbi's Desk



It is no secret that the New Year is quickly approaching, and with it, its message of spiritual evaluation and rededication to a life filled with devotion to God's world. And yet, I never tire of stressing the beauty of Rosh Ha-Shanah and Yom Kippur, in that their eternal message is one of simplicity: we must constantly strive to improve ourselves, and in so doing, make this world a better place in which to live.

Something has come across my desk which, I believe, summarizes perfectly the problems we face as human beings today. Please read it carefully, and then ask yourself: how much of what is written below applies to me? Where am I going right, and in what areas do I need great improvement? If you can honestly look at the following piece and use it to help in self-evaluation (perhaps you might want to take it with you to High Holiday Services and read it over again as we pray together), then this New Year will be one of health, happiness, and peace.

We have taller buildings, but shorter tempers;
Wider freeways, but narrower viewpoints;
We spend more, but have less;
We buy more, but enjoy it less.
We have bigger houses and smaller families;
More conveniences, but less time;
We have more degrees, but less sense;
More knowledge, but less judgment;
More experts, but more problems;
More medicine, but less wellness.

We drink too much, smoke too much,
Spend too recklessly, laugh too little,
Drive too fast, get too angry too quickly,
Stay up too late, get up too tired,
Read too seldom, watch TV too much, and pray too seldom.

We have multiplied our possessions, but reduced our values.

We talk too much, love too seldom and lie too often.
We've learned how to make a living, but not a life;
We've added years to life, not life to years.
We've been all the way to the moon and back,
But have trouble crossing the street to meet the new neighbor.

We've conquered outer space, but not inner space;
We've done larger things, but not better things;
We've cleaned up the air, but polluted the soul;
We've split the atom, but not our prejudice;
We write more, but learn less; plan more, but accomplish less.

We've learned to rush, but not to wait;
We have higher incomes; but lower morals;
More food but less appeasement;
We build more computers to hold more information,

These are the times of fast foods and slow digestion;
Tall men, and short character;
Steep profits, and shallow relationships.

Of fancier houses, but broken homes.

Overweight bodies, and pills that do everything

And nothing in the stockroom.

NOTES FROM THE HAZZAN

During the months of July and August, I went on sabbatical. I thank everyone who made it possible, from the Board to everyone who pitched in to help out while I was away. If I were to title this article, it would not be "What I Did This Summer," but rather, "What I Learned This Summer."

There is no way for me to share all the incredible experiences I had this summer in one Bulletin article, so I have decided to share a little each month. My family and I were able to travel to many places: Akron, Boston, Cape Cod, Niagara Falls and Camp Ramah in Canada. But it is not so much what I did in these places but rather what I learned that I wish to share.

I have always enjoyed the outdoors (although I enjoy my own comfortable mattress too much to go camping), but I often do not have enough time during the year to enjoy it much. Although I try to run or walk in the park as often as possible, when things get busy, that is always the first thing to go. This summer, things were different.

I ran and walked a lot this summer. I ran in Boston. I walked all over Niagara Falls. And while at Camp Ramah, I had the chance to take many runs and walks in an incredibly beautiful setting. But what I enjoyed most of all was kayaking. I cannot remember feeling more peaceful than I did when I was on the lake, rowing and experiencing nature up close. And I did it as often as I could.

At Camp Ramah, we had the chance to pray outdoors several times as well. Each Friday night, the entire camp meets for services at an outdoor bimah at the edge of the woods, overlooking the lake. It is extremely inspiring. And it was during one of these services this summer that I realized that God's creations are truly awesome. And as I looked over the peaceful lake, I started to recall many of the other awesome sights I had witnessed during the summer.

At Cape Cod, my family and I went whale watching. I was not sure exactly what to expect, but was mesmerized as soon as I saw the first whale. They are magnificent creatures, incredibly large and yet beautifully graceful. I could not take my eyes off of from them. At Niagara Falls - which I have visited many times before - I still could not get over how spectacular a sight the Falls are. And it occurred to me that only God could have fashioned these awe-inspiring wonders.

As we approach the High Holidays, I know that many of us will be seeking out God more urgently than we might during the rest of the year. One does not necessarily need to be outdoors to experience God, but I sometimes find it easier to find God in nature than in the man-made surroundings indoors.

And although we could theoretically hold services outdoors, I do not think it is logistically practical. Luckily, our tradition has a solution.

Five days after Yom Kippur, we celebrate the holiday of Sukkot. It is an amazing holiday, one rooted in nature, and sadly, one that many of us do not observe at all. On Sukkot, we are instructed to build a *sukkah* - a temporary booth - and to dwell in it. For most people, that means sitting inside it and eating meals there. Some people sleep in their *sukkah* (but not me...see my comment above about camping). And most people decorate their *sukkah*.

I did not grow up building a *sukkah*, but have done so ever since I lived in my own house. I must admit that I was a bit intimidated initially, but now my family and I look forward to Sukkot every year. Not only do we feel a connection to our ancient tradition, but being outside celebrating in a Jewish way is, as I have said, truly awesome.

This year, Sukkot begins on Monday evening, October 13. I encourage each of you to commit to celebrating Sukkot this year. If you are interested in building your own *sukkah*, there are many resources available online. It is not too late and it is easier than you think. Please contact me if you need help getting started. If that is a bit too intimidating for you, join us at the synagogue *sukkah*, where we will eat and celebrate after each service during Sukkot. Give it a try. I guarantee you will enjoy it. God's creations are indeed awesome. I look forward to joining you this Sukkot as we learn to appreciate them together.

Dear B'nai Israelites,

For many of us, one of the most important parts of the Services during the High Holy Days is the Yizkor Service on Yom Kippur. It is at that time when we turn our thoughts to our Loved Ones who have left this Earth, and we use this meaningful time to reflect upon their lives, as well as the lives of all those who were members of our congregation, family and friends. In addition, we take the time to formally recognize the Martyrs of our people, most especially the Six Million who were murdered during the Holocaust.

As part of this process, we have printed (for the families who wish) the names of those Loved Ones, memorialized in print in the Honor Guide for Yom Kippur. I am happy to announce that, beginning this year, we will be printing a more permanent **Yizkor Book**, which will also contain the Yizkor Service, the list of those who are memorialized on the synagogue's *Yahrzeit* plaques, and a memorial to the Six Million. Not only will this book be more substantial and permanent, but anyone who wishes will be able **to take it home** with them, for use during the year.

Of course, we will still publish dedications in memory of those whose families would like to have them printed (as we have always done). I would urge **everyone** to take advantage of this opportunity, as a way of remembering those dearest to us, and at the same time, helping the congregation. The price is still the same – an order form is printed below.

This is something that I have done in my previous congregations – and the response has always been extremely positive. I hope that you will all join me in this endeavor. I look forward to greeting everyone during the High Holy Days.

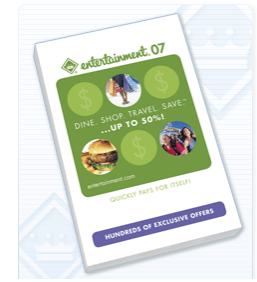

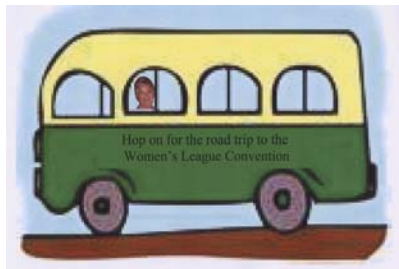
