# From the Rabbi's Desk



The first idea to which we are exposed in school is: “practice makes perfect”. In other words, preparation is everything. If we want to enjoy a special event, if we desire to present a program or plan to a group, we know that it will only succeed if the preparation is adequate. The longer we live and experience life, the more this truism comes to the fore.

It should, therefore, be no surprise that the Rabbis use this principle concerning the approaching High Holy Days of Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur, which are intrinsically bound up in the Ten Days of Repentance. For an entire month, the month of Elul, we sound the *Shofar* every day (except Shabbat) to remind us of the importance of the days ahead.

In addition, the Saturday evening before Rosh Hashanah (this year, Sept. 24<sup>th</sup>), we hold our traditional Selichot Service to usher in the High Holy Day season. Please join us this year – it is a wonderful way to prepare for the New Year.

Why all of the preparation? Let me explain - As our New Year approaches, we are commanded to make amends during this month of Elul to everyone whom we have wronged, either knowingly or unknowingly. We prepare ourselves for the synagogue to be full, to speak of life and death, and to make a serious commitment to change our lives. Or do we?

Why do you come to shul on the High Holy Days? I would like you to try and grapple with this important question BEFORE you walk through the doors of the B'nai Israel in about a month from now. Do you come merely to be seen? Do you come out of a sense of obligation or fear? HDo you approach Rosh Hashanah as you would the secular New Year; as a simple commemoration of the passage of time? If so, you really need to readjust your thinking – to reorient yourself to the Jewish approach to a New Year.

Let this New Year begin the right way – with a serious self-examination of our souls. Instead of talking to our neighbor during the service – read the words of the very powerful and moving liturgy that is before you; take some time to think about creating real solutions for the problems which present themselves in you life right now. And most of all – use your Judaism as a serious source of strength for your life. Let this year be the beginning of a new life.

On behalf of myself, Meira, Ari and Rachel, Rachel and Dan, Dani, Reena, and Eliana, please accept our wishes for a happy and healthy New Year.

## NOTES FROM THE CANTOR

As I write this 1<sup>st</sup> article and High Holy Day message to you, our wonderful new Congregation, my heart beats with anticipation and excitement as well as the array of emotions associated with a major relocation.

Our family with (then) 3 very young children moved from Connecticut to Arizona 20 years ago. Yet despite this consistency I am used to change, having emigrated from my native South Africa to the USA right out of college, where I embraced a new life in a new country.

So change is not alien to me, nor to my dear wife Jan who was born and raised in New Jersey and whom I met at my shul in Connecticut. Jan is back in Arizona where she is a real estate agent and has listed our home for sale, but she is looking forward to getting to know all of you.

New beginnings and their accompanying changes are not easy, as we say in Hebrew kol hat'halot kashot – all beginnings are hard. (It sounds better in Hebrew as it rhymes and alliterates). My musical tradition is an accumulation from my late father's Polish background as well as South Africa, Connecticut and Arizona amongst other influences. Nevertheless I plan to respect and blend with Congregation B'nai Israel's long history and wonderful tradition avodat hakodesh/holy work of my predecessors such as Hazzan Gloth who's more than a decade of service is all some of our youth have ever experienced.

I look forward to feedback and communication so that ongoing dialogue between us will help ensure that I serve you in the best way I know.

Thank you for your outpouring of warmth and hospitality as you have opened your hearts and homes to us and showered us with generosity and kindness this community seems to have a reputation for. You are too numerous to mention by name but I must acknowledge the younger CBI'ers who, amongst other things, helped me unpack and transform my office from chaos to order.

At my 1<sup>st</sup> CBI Board meeting on August 10<sup>th</sup> I spoke about a shul being a house, it is called in Hebrew beit kneset, a house of gathering. **The Calling By Blair Grubb MD \$15.00**

During the last 30 years I have had the honor and privilege of sharing in my patients’ lives. I have watched people face illness, disability and death with a nobility of spirit that leaves me in awe. Listening to them has helped me understand my own life more clearly. In these pieces I recount those stories (as best my memory can recall) that have filled and greatly enriched my life, stories of myself as well as ordinary men, women and children who find themselves in extraordinary situations.

**My Three Lives By Philip Markowicz \$20.00**

As time went on, however, Philip realized his story needed to be told, if for no other reason than to memorialize his family and all the Jews who lost their lives at the hands of the Nazis. My Three Lives, by Philip Markowicz, is an inspiring story of a man who courageously endured hardship with faith and triumphed to rebuild his life and family with love.

A native of Poland, Philip Markowicz has lived in the greater Toledo area of northwest Ohio for fifty-eight years and winters in Aventura, Florida. He is a retired businessman. Philip is an active member of the Jewish community through Congregation B’nai Israel in Sylvania, Ohio, and the Aventura Turnberry Jewish Center of Aventura, Florida. His interests include Torah and Talmud study.

## PARTNERSHIP WITH ISRAEL/P2K

I had the wonderful opportunity to be part of a Congregational Leaders' Mission to Israel's Western Galilee Region sponsored by Toledo Jewish Federation and the Federations of North America in partnership with the Jewish Agency for Israel. The Partnership supports many integral programs as; Arts, Education, Missions, Marketing and Medical(the Western Galilee Hospital.)

Kivunim: a program for Special Needs Youth in Israel, one of the programs, is a direction for Special Needs Youth with a goal to advance and empower this at-risk but promising population through programs that emphasize the capabilities and strength of the youth, rather than focusing on their weaknesses. To reach its goals, each Kivunim program combines *volunteer community service, academic, professional and/or life-skills learning, and independent group living component*. Kivunim is unique in that it sees its target group, young adults with physical and sensory disabilities, chronic illnesses, as important members of and potential contributors to society. Kivunim programs are based on the premise that young people who are trained to see themselves as agents of social change, irrespective of their social challenges, will grow up to be adults who are then capable of taking responsibility for themselves and their lives. The organization works to affect change on the individual, family, local community, and societal levels through raising awareness and challenging assumptions about people with handicaps and their legitimate place in society. Kivunim programs teach self-sustainability and confidence, long term investment that will serve to minimize expensive and irreversible future dependency.

Kivunim's programs serve parents, teenagers and young adults, ages 12-30 with physical and sensory disabilities with a focus on those mainstreamed in the regular educational system. At any given time, approximately 156,000 children and youth are defined as special needs in Israel. Twenty three percent of these (36,000) are in special education frameworks. Seventy-seven percent of them (120,000) are mainstreamed into regular education frameworks. There are over 230,000 people with disabilities aged 18-65 who receive various types of benefits from the National Insurance. Only 15% of those receiving disability benefits are involved in some form of vocational program. Kivunim programs aim to change this reality.

In next month's issue of The Toledo Jewish News I will go into detail about the programs that comprise Kivunim.

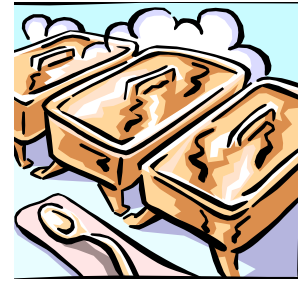

On Rosh Hashanah it is tradition to walk to a river or spring (preferably one that has fish in it) and recite special prayers called penitential prayers. The Tashlich prayer comes from the Book of Micha (7:18-20). After you say the prayers you throw the bread crumbs into the water.

Tossing the bread crumbs on the water is symbolic of casting away our sins and starting a new year with a clean slate.

When the Temple stood in Jerusalem, the Jewish people used lulav and etrog on the first day. Once the Temple was destroyed, the rabbis decreed that all Jews should wave the lulav and etrog all seven days as a remembrance of Temple days.
