A Different Sefirah/Counting

A few years ago, for the current period in our Jewish calendar known as 'Sefirat Ha'omer – The Counting of the Omer,' I wrote an article in our bulletin titled 'Numbering Our Days'. In it, I described the many different religious and historical observances during this 49-day period of the Omer.

Beginning with Pesach, these include Yom Hashoah – Holocaust Commemoration, Yom HaAtzmaut – Israel Independence Day, Lag Ba'omer, Yom Yerushalayim – Jerusalem Reunification Day, culminating on the 50th day of the Omer – Shavuot, when we celebrate receiving the Torah. These observances swiftly take us on an emotional roller coaster from one extreme of our history to the other. Pesach and Shavuot are posted on the two outer extremes as if enclosing and completing a circle of life. Such is the richness of Jewish life experiences.

In our own CBI events calendar, I could not help but notice a remarkable parallelism of regular inspiring events, most during Shabbat services, during the past three months and coming up in the near future. Almost every week on Shabbat there has been or will be a sponsored special event Kiddush to complete our service celebration.

These include Danni Mallin's bat mitzvah, Natalie Bernstein and Seth Baklor's aufruf in anticipation of their June wedding, the honoring of Howard Rosenbaum on his 85th birthday for his lifelong service to CBI, New Family Shabbat when we celebrated with over 30 new families who recently joined CBI, Scholar in Residence Dr. Yonatan Miller, guest inspirational speaker Lutheran Reverend Philip Scherr, the Markowicz family plaque dedication on Pesach and Reaffirmation Service, Religious School closing/USY Shabbat and teacher appreciation, the Lipszyc/Read baby naming, guest speaker Baptist Pastor Dr. Andrew Edwards, and on and on...

In Adult Education, we also enjoyed our own, always-informative, Dr. David Weinberg and the ever-inspiring, Rabbi Alan Sokobin. I presented 'The Golden Age of Yiddish Music' and talented Maestro Yuval Zaliouk presented 'American Jewish Composers: The Creators of American Music.' We had a wonderful Purim celebration and spiel, the Rabbi Morton Goldberg Memorial lecture, and a packed group for the CBI Women's Rosh Chodesh Nisan program, to name but a few highlights.

It is likely that the vast majority of our synagogue membership enjoyed at least one program or service during this feverish three-month period of activity. I am elated that our building is being utilized to the extreme, for which it was intended, and our devoted staff and guest participants all rose to the occasion.

Highlights of upcoming events which I hope you will continue to support include Confirmation the morning of May 5th, the community Yom HaShoah/Yom HaZikaron/Yom HaAtzmaut program, the afternoon of May 5th, and an inspirational Shabbat and Shavuot Tikkun the weekend of June 7th - 10th with guest scholar Rabbi Yehoshua Mizrachi.

Such is the wealth of Jewish life experiences at CBI, providing a wide array of intriguing subjects, with something for everyone no matter your level of observance. By supporting these, each of us at CBI can make this 'Sefirat Ha'omer' period a true period in which 'every day counts.'

Happy Birthday Israel

On May 14, 1948, the 5th of Iyar 5708 the modern state of Israel was founded. These words were the beginning of my confirmation speech that I gave 55 years ago. It is amazing what this tiny little country, which is about the same size of New Jersey, has accomplished over the past 71 years. Actually it is beyond incredible what Israelis have done in such a short period of time.

For many Jewish Americans, we know so much about Israel; however I am somewhat amazed how many of us, especially amongst the younger generation, know so little about the history, politics, people and the land itself. Too many Americans get their information from the internet, television and newspapers. I remember a saying that I learned while an undergraduate at Miami University that goes, "when there's Jews there's news". This is not a favorable quote. Too often there is a distinct anti-Jewish, anti-Zionist, anti-Israel bias on the airwaves and in print. It is so easy to fall in to the trap of reading and believing what one hears and reads. The new buzz word for this is "fake news". I often consult Honest Reporting. com to find out the truth in regard to news about Israel. I am not going to discuss politics or policy in this short article since that would take a treatise to make a small dent on that topic. Rather, I would like to dote on so many of the wonderful and mind boggling achievements that this tiny country has achieved with just a bit of a Yiddishe Kopf thrown in.

Israel is the largest immigrant absorbing country in the world relative to its size. It has absorbed 350% of its population in the past 60 years. Compare that to the proportionately very small immigrant situation we have in America today. Israel has the eighth longest life expectancy of 82 years which is more than the US and the UK. Israel is only second to the US with the number of companies listed on the NASDAQ stock market. It is second in the world for venture capital funds. Israel is in a league of its own with water reuse and reclamation. Israel recycles over 75% of all the water it uses. In comparison US is hovering at about 15% reuse of water. Israel is a world leader in the use of water and desalination. Drip irrigation, used all over the world was invented in Israel. Israel lives in a climate similar to California and in spite of limited water and drought; the country is totally water self-sufficient. About 93% of Israel homes use solar energy to heat their water, the highest percentage in the world.

Israel has more Nobel Prizes per capita than any other country. Did you know that cell phone technology was an Israeli invention? The cell phone camera, the touch screen, voicemail technology and so many other features on your cell phone are Israeli inventions. Antivirus software technology was developed in Israel. Israel has more symphony orchestras per capita than any other nation in the world. Medical care in Israel is on par with the most advanced hospitals in the world. Medical care is free to all Israelis through the national health care system. Many major medical advances used all over the world came from Israeli scientists and physicians. One of the numerous innovations introduced to the world is the TENS unit, which has helped pain sufferers all over the world. This was invented by my father in law, Joseph Tannenbaum z"l. He was the former chair of bioelectronic medical engineering at Hadassah Hospital. Israel ranks number one in the world for cancer survival rates. Israelis invented a video camera in a small pill that can take pictures of the entire intestinal tract after it is swallowed. Israel does more in-vitro fertilization per capita than any other country and it's free of charge.

Israel's armed forces are one of the top five in the world which is amazing for such a small country and its air force is the fourth largest in the world. Did you know that Israel is the only country that drafts women into the military? Israel is the only country to have both Intel's and Microsoft's research divisions outside of the USA. The best GPS system on earth called Waze is an Israeli invention. Did you know that the USB memory stick is an Israeli invention? Israel is the world's second highest per capita producer of new books. You have probably heard that Israel was on the verge of landing a space vehicle on the moon. Even though the landing didn't work out as planned, it is still amazing that Israel was able to put a space vehicle into lunar orbit. 

Now it has miraculously resurfaced through the efforts of the Yiddish Scientific Institute (YIVO) and has been beautifully translated for a new generation.







Multimedia masterpiece Different Trains at the Toledo Museum of Art

An important reminder of one of the greatest tragedies in human history, *Different Trains*, a large-scale video installation spanning nearly 25 feet, is in the Toledo Museum of Art's Canaday Galley until May 5, 2019.

The profoundly moving work about the Holocaust is both historically important and aesthetically impressive. The 29-minute film runs on a continuous loop and features the 1988 musical score by American composter Steve Reich, recorded by the Kronos Quartet and visually reinterpreted by Spanish filmmaker Beatriz Caravaggio.

Reich's 1988 score is a beautiful and emotionally charged rumination on the train journeys of his youth and of the horrific deportation trains of the Holocaust. The work was awarded the 1989 Grammy for the Best Contemporary Classical Composition.

Created by Caravaggio in 2016, *Different Trains* sets Reich's score to an archival film montage that lends new depths and insights to the original musical composition. Both the music and videos are beautifully composed; Reich's score is fragmented and modern, while Caravaggio's editing swiftly leads the audience through the work.


