Home As Sanctuary

I don't yet know exactly what our upcoming High Holidays services of 5781/2020 will look like. As you read this, I am daily drawing up plans for services that simultaneously satisfy three major considerations.

First is the necessity of doing justice to what Judaism calls *matbe'a shel tefila*, roughly translated as 'halachic prayer integrity.' Second, and more important, is that those in actual physical attendance in our sanctuary should be detained a maximum of approximately two hours based on current health and safety guidance we are receiving daily.

The third consideration is that almost our entire congregation will only be able to experience our services through Livestream or occasionally Zoom. How long can I expect you to feasibly sit (or stand as the case might be) in front of your computer, laptop, ipad, cell phone or other device to 'experience' or even 'participate' in our services? Even two hours is optimistic on my part. Research indicates that during Livestream programs, people come and go, log on and off sporadically. So how do we balance technology and the spirituality the High Holidays are supposed to promote?

Daily, I am exchanging notes (no musical pun intended) with Cantorial and Rabbinical colleagues around the world. Every denomination and all clergy are facing the same issues, so no need to reinvent the wheel. For example, in my former and my mother's current South Africa, government mandates will allow 10% capacity in synagogues these High Holidays. No one over age 60 will be admitted. My mother will be 98 in a few weeks, so her High Holidays will be spent at home, with no Livestream or Zoom, as she has no computer. Besides, 90% of South African synagogues are Orthodox, which precludes Livestream or Zoom. Her synagogue is large with a capacity of some 1200, so they will allow approximately 120 to attend. Our mandates are similar in the USA.

Whatever the outcome, the liturgy of our services this year will be dissevered. A normally five hour service of Rosh Hashana or Yom Kippur, must be condensed to last two hours. This means a half hour for Shachrit, half hour for Torah and haftorah, half hour Musaf, leaving a half hour for sermon, shofar, conclusion, etc. In addition, on Yom Kippur we must accommodate Yizkor and the Avodah service – all within around 2 hours!

Here's an additional dilemma for your consideration. Those who have attended our Livestream and Zoom services during the unprecedented past five months, will have noticed that I have eliminated all Kaddish prayers except for one Mourner's Kaddish at the conclusion. On the High Holidays, the various Kaddish prayers besides the Mourner's Kaddish are integral to the integrity of *nusach* – the magnificent traditional musical modes we call *misinai* – meaning they have taken on relevance as if they were from Moses at Sinai. There are no less than eight different *misinai* melodies for the Kaddish, such as evening service, morning service, Musaf, the famous Chassidic Kaddish, etc. Omitting them would not do justice to the integrity of our liturgy.

The same dilemma is presented by elaborate prayers such as Kol Nidrei, Unetaneh Tokef, Hin'ni (the Hazzan's personal prayer on behalf of the congregation), the Avodah, and so many others. Our Machzor High Holidays prayer book is an extraordinarily magnificent compilation of several thousand years of inspiration, poetry, music and history. Most major prayers will have to be curtailed or adapted.

We have already begun the High Holidays as we are in the final month of Elul in our calendar cycle. We are sounding the shofar daily and reciting Psalm 27 twice a day. One reason for Psalm 27 is sentence 4, which states: "One thing I ask of the Lord – that I be able to dwell in His House all the days of my life, so as to behold His sweetness while visiting His Sanctuary." Unfortunately, that will not happen for most this year.

Bear in mind that each of our homes is a Sanctuary of God, a place of holiness, where daily we can and should have a spiritual encounter with Hashem. During this spiritual climax of our year, I hope you will join us by Livestream, Zoom, or however you are able to connect. I wish our entire congregation l'shana tova tikateivu v'teichateimu – may we all be inscribed for a blessed year!

The Abraham Accord

It has proven to be a historic week in the history of the Jewish state. Israel and the United Arab Emirates struck a major diplomatic agreement with the help of the U.S. administration and the President. It is the third such agreement for Israel in the Middle East and the first since 1994. Previous accords with Egypt in 1979 and Jordan in 1994 have shown how cooperation without aggression can be a benefit for all parties. Similarities overcome differences.

Israel and the UAE will move to direct passenger flights, opening embassies and trading ambassadors. The future holds greater cooperation on investment, tourism, security, technology, energy and other areas. There is already a signed COVID-19 research agreement between medtech companies in each country. One example of how peace between just two peoples can benefit all.

Why is the new deal between Israel and the UAE important? It shows what can be done when differences are put aside and a better future is seized upon. Long held beliefs that the Middle East is just a geopolitical quagmire with no solution is being disproven. It opens the door for similar understandings between Israel and other Arab countries. Who is next? Oman? Qatar? Saudi Arabia? All are potential places for that next moment in history.

Israel established diplomatic ties with the Muslim-majority country of Azerbaijan in 1992. That friendship has blossomed to form an indispensable partnership in the fields of agricultural technology, telecommunications and defense. Religious life among the small Jewish community of Azerbaijan is actively encouraged by the government with a growing number of synagogues as well as a yeshiva and kosher butcher shop in an area where many Jews live. Cultural exchanges and tourism have further built friendships and trust between the peoples of both countries.

Of course, with any peace agreement, there are detractors. Those immersed in the status quo. Those that benefit from existing hatreds and lack of trust. Countries that have their own agendas and manipulate human differences for their own reasons and not the greater good of humanity. Differences can be weaponized with propaganda and lies. It is incredibly difficult to overcome such indoctrination but it can be done! Much in the same way anger can be used against others, it can also be the reason for its own destruction. At some point people will see that if others can establish peace and prosperity through mutual respect and cooperation, why can't they? They look to their leadership and demand it.

I am a believer that these peace agreements between Israel and the Arab world will prove to be a transformative time in our history. Hatred can spread like a virus but peace can be the cure that saves us all.
